**Report of the Independent Auditors to the Members of
Hull City Centre (Bid) Ltd**

We have audited the financial statements of Hull City Centre (Bid) Ltd for the year ended 30th September 2007 on pages five to seven. These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein and the requirements of the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).
